

Horsie Named Three did not like bullies.







Horsie Named Three had his mind made up. NO SHOES!




Horsie Named Three liked to play in the mud




Horsie Named Three stepped on a stone and it hurt.




Horsie Named Three was loved by his mother. She took care of him.




Horsie Named Three plays soccor with his friend Dog.




The driveway was very hot. Horsie Named Three burnt his feet.




Mom washed Horsie's feet.







Horsie Name Three stepped on glass.




Horsie Name Three looked. His foot was bleeding.




Horsie's mom gave him a bandaid for his cut.



Horsie Name Three and his mom have a talk.




Horsie thinks shoes might not be a bad idea.




Horsie Name Three shows off his new shoes.




Horsie Name Three plays on the gravel.






Horsie heard a C-R-U-N-C-H



Horsie saw that his shoes broke the glass. He didn't even feel it.




Horsie Name Three is very happy wearing shoes.
